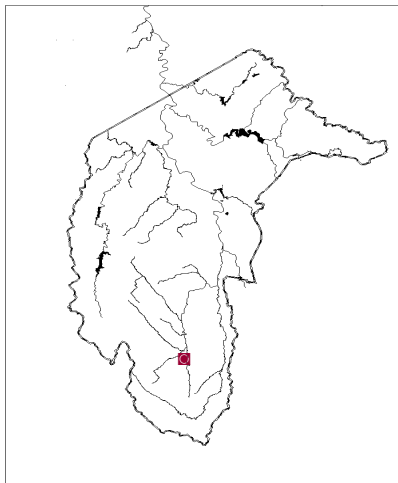


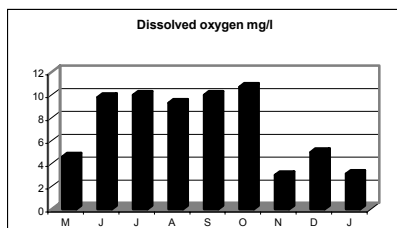
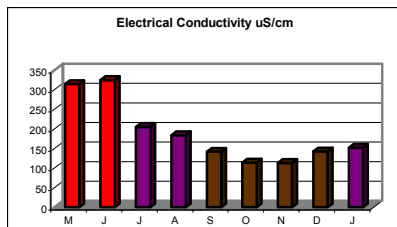
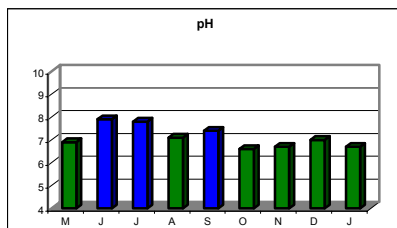
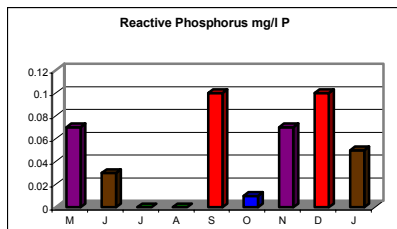
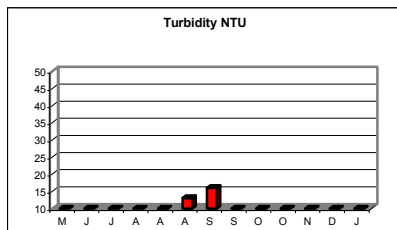
Hospital Creek North—Gudgenby

- May: Water collected from still pool. The creek was no more than a series of these.
- June: Localised scum beginning to form in now flowing creek.
- July: Frogs evident. Abundant water plants and flying insects.
- August: EC levels were markedly higher than last month and have reversed the downward trend of the last three months. Algae in pools possibly Cladophora or Enteromorpha.
- September: Four wood ducks, white faced heron, water muddied by activity, new reed growth, frogs present.
- November: Oily film on the surface.
- December: Prolific aquatic and riparian plant life—considerable increase in the past 5 weeks.
