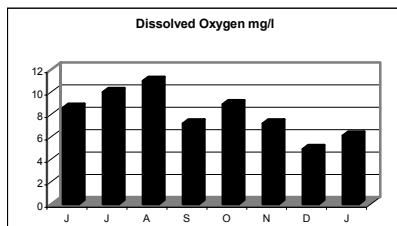
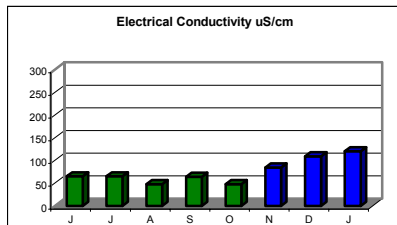
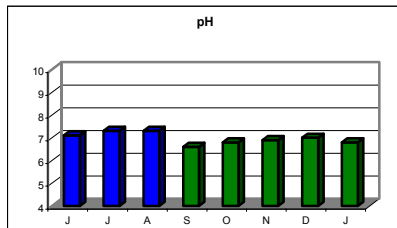
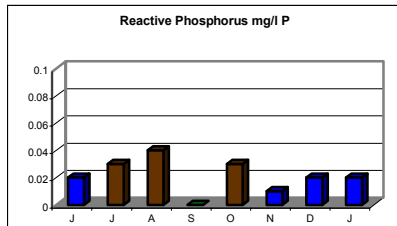
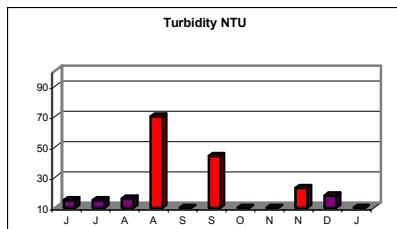


Participant Comments: G. Hall & J Goodrum

- Azolla aquatic weed present, chocking the waterway.
- June: 4WD cars across the River causing banks to be badly disturbed.
- Wildlife includes crested pigeons, crimson rosellas, magpies, blue wrens, Crinia signifera frogs.
- August: Rocks put in place to stop 4 wheel drives accessing the water.
- Turbidity results interesting with low turbidity after substantial rain on the 14th and high turbidity readings after thunderstorms on the 24 September.
- December: After rains heavy mud on banks and stream bed washed down after heavy rains.
