Freedom of information request: 19/05078

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by the Environment, Planning and Sustainable Development Directorate (EPSDD) on 8 February 2019, in which you sought access to information relating to development application, DA-201630753 (44 Macleay Street Turner) for the period 18 August 2017 to the date of receipt of your request being the 8 February 2019.

Specifically, you are seeking:

"...All documents relating to DA201630573 and DA201630573S144C between 18 August 2017 and 8 February 2019."

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

The EPSDD was required to provide a decision on your access application by 8 March 2019.

Decision on access

Searches were completed for documents relevant to your access request and 28 documents were identified that fall within the scope of your request.

I have included as **Attachment A** to this decision the schedule of documents relevant to the scope of your request. The schedule provides a description of each document and the access to these documents.

I have decided to grant access, under section 50 of the Act, to 11 copies of documents with exemptions applied to information that I would consider would be contrary to the public interest to disclose.

I have decided to refuse access to 1 document in full under section 50 of the Act as I consider majority of information contained in the documents to be contrary to the public interest. Although the Directorate could prepare an edited copy of this document, modified with deletions, it is my opinion that the remaining information would be of little to no value. Therefore, I am satisfied on balance that releasing information is not in the public interest to disclose under section 17 of the Act, as it does not promote scrutiny of government decision making or reveal the reasoning for a government decision.

I have decided to grant access in full, to 16 documents relevant to your request.

My decisions on access are further detailed in the following statement of reasons and the documents released to you are provided as **Attachment B** to this letter.

Material considered

In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:

- the *Freedom of Information Act 2016*, with consideration given to sections 17, 35 and Schedules 1, 2 and 3;
- the content of the documents that fall within the scope of your request;
- the release of information concerning third parties; and
- information contained within the public domain

Exempted documents

My reasons for deciding not to grant access to documents and components of information held within identified documents are as follows:

Contrary to the public interest information under Schedule 2 of the FOI Act

In assessing the public interest, I must apply the descending test outlined under section 17 of the Act which requires consideration of all factors favouring disclosure, any favouring nondisclosure and the balance of those factors when considered collectively.

Personal Information

I have considered the release of personal information and my view in this instance is that the identification of third parties would not serve to further open discussion, government accountability, informed debate and the provision of contextual information.

I am satisfied that the disclosure of this personal information could reasonably be expected to prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy under the *Human Rights Act 2004*. Disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to interfere with the protection of the privacy of the individual's concerned this is a factor favouring nondisclosure under Schedule 2.2 (a) (ii) of the Act.

On balance of these public interest considerations and the information available, I have concluded that disclosure of the identified personal information contained within the documents may constitute a breach of those individuals' privacy and is therefore contrary to the public interest.

Online publishing – disclosure log

Under section 28 of the Act, EPSDD maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. Your original access application and my decision will be published in the EPSDD disclosure log after 24 August 2018. Your personal contact details will not be published. Ombudsman review

My decision on your access request is a reviewable decision as identified in Schedule 3 of the Act. You have the right to seek Ombudsman review of this outcome under section 73 of the Act within 20 working days from the day that my decision is published in the disclosure log, or a longer period allowed by the Ombudsman.
