Block 7 Section 23 FORREST The Pines, 21 Furneaux Street FORREST

The "Pines" at 21 Furneaux Street, Manuka, is an example of significant architecture and is potentially an urban design and educational resource. It was built at the time when the Inter-War Spanish Mission Style (1915-1940) was a new architectural style in Australia. The design incorporates features which are peculiar to the style including Spanish (cordova) root tiles, grouped arch openings, twisted columns and ornamental metalwork.

The architecture of this building may contribute to the education of designers and planners in the understanding of inter-war architectural styles.

Its architecture contributes to the urban form of Manuka which features a number of other buildings in the same or similar styles.
