### **Freedom of Information 20/65318**

I refer to your application made under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act) received by the Suburban Land Agency (the Agency) on 7 September 2020, in which you sought access to documents relating to the Throsby 'Book to Buy' process.

Specifically, you are seeking:

1. *Audit logs of the Book to Buy registration for the Throsby land release from the 1st of September 2020 to the 3rd of September 2020.*

1.1 *In accordance with the privacy Act, I would like to request my personal information be released to myself.*

I am an Information Officer appointed under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

The Agency must make a decision on your application on or by 2 October 2020.

### **Searches Conducted**

Comprehensive searches were conducted and one document within the scope of your application was identified.

### **Decision on Access**

I have included as **Attachment A** to this decision the schedule listing the relevant document. The schedule provides a description of the document that falls within the scope of your application and the access decision for this document.

I have decided to grant partial access to the document and, in accordance with section 50 of the Act, provide you with a copy of the document with deletions applied to contrary to the public interest information.

My access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons and the document released to you is provided as **Attachment B** to this letter.

### **Material Considered**

In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:

- the FOI Act, particularly sections 6, 17, 50, and schedule 2 of the Act
- the content of the document that fall within the scope of your request
- the *Information Privacy Act 2014*

## **Public Interest Considerations**

My reasons for deciding not to grant access to components of this documents are as follows:

### **Information Disclosure – Schedule 2 of the Act**

The Act recognises the right of every person to obtain access, under its provisions, to government information (see section 7, the Act). As an Information Officer, I am required to allow access to information subject to the Act, unless, on balance, disclosure would be contrary to the public interest.

In assessing the public interest, I must apply the test outlined under section 17 of the Act which requires consideration of factors favouring disclosure, any favouring nondisclosure and the balance of those factors when considered cumulatively.

#### *Factors Favouring Disclosure*

In applying the public interest test, I have determined that disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to do the following:

- Schedule 2.1(a)(iii) – inform the community of the government’s operations, including the policies, guidelines and codes of conduct followed by the government in its dealings with members of the community.

#### *Factors favouring Nondisclosure*

In applying the public interest test, I have determined that disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to do the following:

- Schedule 2.2(a)(ii) – prejudice the protection of an individual’s right to privacy or any other right under the *Human Rights Act 2004*.

### Personal Information

The document relevant to your application contains personal information of individuals. I have considered how the public interest would be advanced by releasing this information in part or in whole. It is my view that the information if disclosed, could reasonably be expected to prejudice the protection of an individual’s right to privacy under section 12 of the *Human Rights Act 2004*. On balance, and the information available to me, I am satisfied that the disclosure of this personal information is not in the public interest.

To provide you with the information that I have determined to be in the public interest to release, a copy of the document has been prepared with personal information redacted in accordance with section 50 and the Objects of the Act.

### **Charges**

No charges are applicable to this application, the number of pages to be released is below the minimum threshold.

### **Online Publication**

Under section 28 of the Act, on behalf of the Agency, Environment, Planning and Sustainable Development Directorate (EPSDD) maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. Your original access application, this decision and the document released will be published in the EPSDD disclosure log no earlier than three days after you receive this decision. Your personal information will not be published.

### **Ombudsman Review**

My decision on your access request is a reviewable decision as identified in Schedule 3 of the Act. You have the right to seek Ombudsman review of this outcome under section 73 of the Act within 20 working days from the day that my decision is published in the disclosure log, or a longer period allowed by the Ombudsman.
