PHONE CALL: Swooped and pecked on ears while cycling, did not dismount. Provided feedback on reporting system. Wanted to know what our processes are, and what will happen with this magpie; was informed of our risk assessment process, and assured that this magpie was on our radar and being assessed. She referenced the magpie reporting site to highlight other people's injuries, has emailed photos of her injury. Advice given on what to do if being swooped on a bike, some suggestions for PPE. She would like to be updated of what happens with this magpie so she can know when it is safe to cycle that way again.

Euthanasia is currently being requested for this bird

Magpie has been reported numerous times, drawn blood on multiple occasions. Caller is worried that it could get someone's eyes as it is getting bolder. The caller had previously said (see prior report) he had prior hit the magpie with a ball thrower "really hard" as it had swooped near his face. The magpie is now viciously going after him on a regular basis, and has struck near the eye. His housemate has a laceration on his head. He also said that he had got into an argument with his neighbour over accusations of inhumane behaviour, as he said he had been seen chasing it out the front of his house, trying to hit it with something in a bid to chase it off. I advised against this; stating that whilst self defence is reasonable, it is illegal to go to excessive lengths to intentionally cause harm. I also mentioned, as with the first incident, that hostile behaviour towards them is likely to exacerbate the protective behaviours. He believes this bird requires removal for the safety of the public. He says he is being targeted in his own yard and whenever he goes outside. I had observed it swooping him at his front door, so this is probable. I advised him to wear a broad hat and sunnies for his own protection in the meantime, as this will mitigate most of the risk presented by this behaviour. I explained the approval and removal process may take longer than the period in which the behaviour may resolve itself, given that this behaviour should be stopping soon. This was not well received. He is understandably upset at feeling attacked in his own yard, but may have directly contributed to the increasing aggression of the bird. Regardless of the cause, at this stage it seems that the bird's behaviour is creating a risk unacceptable to public safety, having been connected to numerous reported injuries (yet to confirm visual) and its location at a high use area, and may require euthanasia. **SUBSEQUENT PHONE CALL:** Asked caller to send photo evidence of his and the housemate's injuries. He became argumentative, stating "you're going to take a bird's word over mine?" No photos have been forthcoming at present. Subsequent site visit 6/10/21 [REDACTED] Observed the magpie making contact several times with one jogger, and repeatedly swooping a pedestrian (very close but no contact) for 2 blocks. The magpie made contact with my head numerous times (wearing a hat so no injury). The neighbour who was arguing with the caller stopped for a conversation, in which she alleged that the caller had been "drunk and laughing while antagonising the bird with a stick or some tool, while wearing a high vis vest" and that his housemate had been "hiding in a hedge trying to film it". She further alleged that they were "going up and down the street" and had "wandered onto the road without looking trying to get it [either footage or the bird, unsure]". 13/10/21 Upon arrival with intent to capture the bird, man at #18 is feeding the bird. Further discussions are ensuing. **SITE VISIT 28/10/2021** Bird hanging around but not seen swooping at this point. A magpie was in the area gathering nesting materials, uncertain if it is the same one. Nest appears to have been taken by wattlebird.

Swooping in backyard, child and owners. 20 birds sitting on the fence, shed, roof and trees. This sounds like a bird feeding issue. Have not been able to make contact, did a letterbox drop of ACT bird feeding pamphlets in the area. Noticed quite a few birds in the area gathered around [REDACTED]

Backyard swooping magpie. Began since their dog attacked the magpie when it was on the ground. Want advice how to help.

Residents can't walk out to the front yard as bird is swooping. **SITE VISIT 29/10/21** [REDACTED]. Observed magpie swooping two cyclists. In both cases it swooped persistently over a distance of 50m. It appeared to be primarily engaging in beak snaps and displays rather than contact, though it did get a little closer every few dives; it was hard tell if it ever made contact. In either case it was aiming for the top of the helmet. I walked back and forth and was swooped a few times. It occasionally swooped face-on a few times, and a couple of times from the ground toward the side of my head, but flew much higher to swoop from above once closer. Once it made contact, though with a knock to the top of my head with a wing (video available).

A conversation with the caller indicated this behaviour had been going on for around a week. She had been hit on the rearward top of her head and had received a scratch; has been provided with an email to send a photo. She also mentioned some children in the neighbourhood antagonise the bird with sticks; deliberately trying to get it to swoop.

She said most people in the neighbourhood are aware of the magpie, which has apparently taken to swooping some residents out the front. They didn't want the magpie euthanised but would be keen for any steps that can be taken to make it safer. Will return with signs as soon as able. Couldn't locate nest or other magpie. Heard one somewhere but was too windy to pinpoint. Seen swooping cyclists on reserve bike path, though they thought it was funny and kept going. Seen swooping a woman who dismounted after seeing bird, it swooped her a couple of times then stopped. 30/10/2021 Nest still not located, may be in reserve? Signs erected. Will continue to monitor.

Swooping kids in backyard, no contact made yet. Doesn't want a sign as problem is kids in backyard (youngest 4yo). Feel like they can't go outside. Wants a call back from supervisor, unacceptable we can't do anything until his kid is injured.

Reported by daughter. Magpie is swooping the kids in the backyard, parents intervening. Protective clothing worn so no injuries occurring. Mother is reportedly feeding the magpies mince on a regular basis. Previously had called for advice. [REDACTED] Have arranged for a site visit on Monday. [REDACTED] & [REDACTED] attended the residence at 11am. [REDACTED] was not present, only mother. Nest sited and one large fledgling on edge of nest. Swooping of a small child (approx 5/6) was observed but caretaker was not worried by it and took appropriate steps to get the child inside. The intention of the visit was to talk about feeding of the birds but the mother stated that she doesn't frequently feed the birds and the magpies had escalated their swooping behaviour after her daughter had sprayed them with the hose. Please see [REDACTED] if you get another call about this. [REDACTED] phoned [REDACTED] fledglings are now out of nest but magpie is still swooping her children. She is providing them with umbrellas and bucket hats but magpie is swooping from ground under umbrella- no contact is being made but seems to be getting bolder. Has not swooped this week (8/11/21) in the backyard. Will need a follow up site visit.

Reported to [REDACTED] Same as #23 and #42 (Clunies ross and Parkes way)

phoned has asked for signs to be placed so other riders are aware - targeting cyclists

Lake Burley-Griffin bike path, near Parkes way/Sullivans creek bridge. The attack started at this bike underpass (that runs underneath Parkes Way) and concluded where the bike path has an intersection, where one way turns right onto Clunies Ross St and the other way continues along the lake.

Currawong swooping in backyard, concerned about swooping dog. Has never caused injury but is getting close to callers head and her dog. Called and was happy to take advice about timing and PPE.

Swooped their friend (cycling): [REDACTED] **PHONE CALL** Thanked us for addressing the issue

Trapped and Euthanised [REDACTED] 15/10/2021 13:50. Was too difficult to remove from cage trap; put a towel on top of it instead to minimise stress. While driving it got out from the towel, and was flapping about in the cage for a bit on the back of the ute, which some members of the public may have seen..

Caller has reported it is very aggressive, has drawn blood from ear, attacking all passers by. Magpie was observed swooping at least 5 cyclists, most of which ignored it, but a few kept riding while thrashing about or swerving (even after being told dismounting would help). This magpie is of much lower risk if people dismount, and appears to mostly be attacking the back of the helmet/shirt/neck. Will conduct another site assessment shortly and put out some pointed indicators to dismount prior. [REDACTED] 5/10/21 Extra warnings put on the footpaths leading up to the site instructing cyclists to dismount. Only one did preemptively. Another cyclist was spotted being swooped around 4:30-40; they dismounted, and were swooped a few more times before the bird stopped. I rode back and forth a few times, tested out dismounting, and was similarly swooped 4-5 more times before the bird went away, though it did not hit anything besides my helmet. Another cyclist had an earphone knocked out. The bird made contact with numerous other cyclists that passed through the area, though didn't bother any pedestrians at the time. The nest is located in the central median strip, on Bowen drive, in a birch. There are hatched young of indeterminate age in the nest. Given the high density of the area it is probably that someone will likely experience an injury again, as despite sufficient warning people continue to ride through the area.

Bowen park magpie? [REDACTED] Yes; nesting on median strip on Bowen drive

Swooped as she crossed the road from the housing complex driveway. Hit her helmet and swooped her while she was walking her bike. Left a mark but no skin broken. Is happy just for signs.

Customer reported magpie swooping from all directions, hitting people front and side. Notes: This site was visited and signs erected prior, if able another site visit and additional signage may help.

Sounds like this is the same one as last year that was signed off to be euthanised. Nice elderly man to chat to. He was riding his bike past this spot and was swooped several times where it cut his face. When he put an arm up to protect that side it came back for the other side of the face and cut it too. He is sending photos through. He was wearing glasses and a helmet at the time. Need signs and site assessment asap

Unable to assist her catholic care client with shopping or enter the home. Phone call: [REDACTED] just wanted to let us know, she is scared of birds, but her client wasn't actually fussed by it. Site visit: Raining. Spoke to worker in village area he didn't know of any magpie problem there. Have put signs up.

Plover at construction site. Site visit and chat with caller. Eggs taken. Will call again if issues

on bikes had helmets on. site assessment needed.

Plovers swooping students, preventing access to classrooms Phoned 8/9 [REDACTED] Nest will need relocating Hazel to do this 9/9

site visited. Plovers nesting in courtyard adjacent to special needs class. Eggs removed, he will call if they re-lay.

Doesn't sound too bad, [REDACTED] reported one in a separate location earlier this year in Campbell when it scratched her granddaughter. This one has never made contact. She has seen it swoop all types of people. Advised that will probably need 3 signs, one Hasset park entrance, one from Anzac park and one more. Site visit: 3 different magpies seen, many walkers, bikes, dogs went along all sides. Weren't swooping or looking interested. Can hear nest next to Anzac parade.

Swooped 3yo granddaughter and drew blood near eye. 2 other people they spoke to having problems in area as well. Magpie going just for children. Phone call: Was also a problem with their grandson 2 years ago. They would like it removed as is attacking little kids. A man she spoke to thought the bird was no problem and turns out his son is feeding the bird. Caller has sent photo through of cut next to child's eye. Advised to avoid the area and I will put signs up. Site visit: No magpie spotted, raining. Ran into a man who is the leader of the Friends of Hasset Park group, he was aware of the bird and helped show me where I should put signs - active in the group of trees in very south-east corner of the park near small roundabout. 2nd site visit: sunny day a little windy. Over 50 people went by area. Dogs, kids, runners, kicking footy, little kids on bikes. No swooping seen. Magpie seen with stuff in its peak flying to other side of road out of park twice. End of visit kid on bike swooped. 2nd call [REDACTED] grandkids haven't been swooped again and she hasn't heard of any more people being swooped.

Swooping kids on bikes by playground. Attended site no swooping seen.

Bird swooped client and hit her in the helmet

[REDACTED] Call: A bird is swooping the caller's child in the backyard. It swoops the top of their heads, and will run toward them on the ground with its wings puffed out, but has not attacked their face. It apparently yells a lot. The son has autism and as a result she won't let him go outside anymore as she feels he would be unable to react. They have no trees in their backyard and don't know where it is nesting. [REDACTED] Site visit from corridor behind house. 3 people walked by - they have had no problem with swooping and walk regularly. Viewed magpie taking worm to nest in she-oak tree in corridor beside house.

Alley way area: swooping bird swoops from property down walkway at back of house, all the way to Cartwright Street underpass, and opposite direction to playground. Site visit: Got swooped, no contact clicking sound. Spoke to mother with child at playground, they had no problems today but her son was touched on the head whilst on bike once she wasn't fussed.

<p>Was swooped and said he is bleeding. Wants to know what will happen to the currawaong. SITE VISIT [REDACTED] 26/10/2021 observed for 30 min but nothing seen. Two currawongs were sitting on a residential balcony up the street opposite, but didn't do anything. SITE VISIT: 28/10/2021 Spend over an hours observing both sides of the canberra centre (near the legislative building and the Illumacube). A currawong was seen but didn't swoop anyone. The currawong remained up in the trees and didn't appear to be interested in food scraps. Even if the currawong in question is identified; it seems it will be difficult to remove by accepted means; it doesn't appear to be open to baiting (making trapping difficult) and it would be far too high a risk to shoot (urban hard surfaces and structures, people everywhere). Will continue to monitor.</p>
<p>Aggressive Magpie (Glebe park one?)</p>
<p>SIGNS NEEDED Caller was walking through Glebe park on the path, was hit unexpectedly by a magpie. It hit her in the head, left a scratch on her eyelid and just under her eye, but she was OK. She isn't worried about herself, just wanted it to be known as there are a lot of young children around the playgrounds. [REDACTED] 6/10/21 SITE VISIT Magpies and nest located, but no swooping observed. talked with a passer-by who mentioned it had hit her head the previous week, but couldn't speak English very well. When offered an email to report if desired, she expressed that she was just satisfied that we were aware. SIGNS NEEDED Nest located in tall birch/poplar? above Gazebo (unable to see but can hear live young within). Parents were busily engaged in feeding. Council worker operating within the park said he had seen a man swooped yesterday, but that it hadn't made contact. He hadn't seen anyone else bothered. Continue to monitor for further activity. Site visit [REDACTED] Put up signs, 10 people walked/rode through whilst there, none swooped about 8:30am.</p>
<p>Needs signs: swooping from Hill top reserve there is a pathway along June St until Keewong St. Easy chat on phone she's just reporting for other people she hears screaming in the street. Will use protection now. [REDACTED] Site visit: Juvenile seen on ground, 2 magpies but no swooping observed. Signs erected.</p>
<p>SITE VISIT: Walked up and down street, interviewed a few passers-by, nothing seen by anyone, no magpie sighted. A dead magpie found on corner.</p>
<p>Magpie swooping: [REDACTED] 17/10/2021 Nothing seen, magpies still hanging around but not doing anything at the time</p>
<p>Plovers swooping children (there's a program going on there) : [REDACTED] PHONE CALL 02/10/2021 Situation has resolved itself but caller was very dissatisfied that no one had got back to them earlier.</p>
<p>Reported to be very aggressive; caller heard second hand that a kid had been swooped there, which looked like it had make contact. Came back multiple times. [REDACTED] I remember this one from last year). Happy to have some signs put up. Site visit [REDACTED] & [REDACTED] No swooping seen, 3 groups of people having picnics along the grass area next to bike path.</p>
<p>Emailed No further action</p>
<p>Has been swooping since last weekend. Phone call [REDACTED] Nest is in backyard. Wife has been using a umbrella to protect herself which is working as it only swoops from the top. Been swooping for a week. Once made contact on his head. He is happy to take tips and doesn't want the bird to be killed. The gum tree its nesting in is going to be removed by evo energy, he told them there is a nest in it so the tree can't be removed untill they are out. He's going to buy an umbrella now too.</p>
<p>Plover nested smack-bang in middle of oval. Kids were kept away but kept returning to investigate and were being swooped. Given the age of the children, location and need for as much room for the kids as possible (COVID) the singular egg was taken to a carer.</p>

No contact being made, swooping children only site assessment needed. call prior to going. 23/09/21 rang but no answer. 01/10/21 rang again, no answer. Observed magpie but no abnormal behaviour, though park was crowded and multiple types of pedestrians
The magpie swooped and dented my son's helmet. About 15:00. The tree is one of the biggest gums closest to the path. Bird was swooping people ahead, she told them to go faster to get past, it started swooping her 7yo instead, and pecked his helmet 4 times, leaving dints. I advised her in future to get off the bike if experiencing magpie issues, as the injuries received from falling are usually worse. She said they always tell their kids to get off bikes if a magpie is around but that they were too scared. Cogito ergo sum confused.
Has swooped the caller's daughter on the helmet, but not drawn blood. They are taking a different route but signage might help. 22/9/21 Signs. Nest sighted, chick in nest. Magpies were seen down the road, didn't swoop a cyclist, dog walker or passers-by. It did have some mince and may be being fed.
Plovers in area (don't think they've nested yet) caller wants them pre-emptively removed. Was a source of intense emotion last year and doesn't want to go through it again.
Called 1/9/21 Plovers nesting on balcony roof and swooping kids in adjacent yard. They seem to have stopped for the past 2 days. They understand the situation and will try to wait it out. Repeated behaviour from last year.
14:30- 18:00 active on the 2 main crossings in Kingston. making contact. 20-25m persistent swooping. site visit needed SITE VISIT 16/10/2021 2 magpies seen but not observed swooping. Signs placed at 4 points and further up the road. Person was seen feeding one of the magpies.
Caller was swooped (without contact) while walking her grandson in a pram. She had never experienced magpies swooping before and was quite alarmed, and is taking another route now. Was appreciative of the call and didn't want the magpie harmed. Likely someone in the area is feeding birds; over 15 seen in immediate area and they are quite comfortable around people. Will be difficult to distinguish any individual. No swooping observed. Residents and cafe staff haven't seen anything.
Was holding a baby and the bird swooped her on her right hand. SITE VISIT Magpie observed swooping a man in area (they were unfazed) and brushing my hat with its wings. Very fresh fledgling on ground at Buddhist centre, but seemed to have moved on when I came back to the spot with signs a bit later. Signs erected anyway.
Aggressive birds at this location. Caller requests email rather than phone as cannot take calls at work

Magpies aggressively swooping people. People walking around the shopping centre are getting attacked (?? no shop there?)

Hit by magpie and made her cheek bleed. Screamed. Around number **Sch 2 s 2.2(a)(ii)**

Hit on head by magpie. Was swooped a few times while crossing the road, is now aware.

Hit on head whilst wearing a cap, the impact took it off but wasn't injured. Called back for a chat and she appreciates the signs, and her entire complex has been informed by management to take precautions. First year resident has noticed this. NOTES From the look of it the chicks are very fresh (being fed but still barely visible in the nest, not sitting properly). The situation has been inflamed by the resident below the tree instinctually hitting one of the birds (very hard, in his words) with a ball thrower (not intentionally) after it swooped towards him and his dog. He understands they're just being birds and doesn't want it removed, though appears to have made an enemy for life. There is also another nest quite close up the street at number 30 Launceston st. They are occasionally being fed by the resident and appeared quite friendly. The magpies across from Burnie street are the ones swooping (both male and female). They appeared to go for the backs of people's heads, which I saw happen to a lady walking past. She had a hood on, and did not appear harmed besides a fright. It swooped her twice. It didn't try to swoop me at all.

Person attacked by magpie while walking on 2 different days. Hit his head

"Affecting both sides Launceston st" same as other LYONS. Known magpie.

Saw swooping bird signs, turned around, but was swooped by bird before reaching further up marawah st and launceston

Saw swooping bird signs, turned around, but was swooped by bird before reaching further up marawah st and launceston

Spoke to rebecca on the phone for a while. She was swooped whilst walking with her baby in the pram. She is now going to use a different route just wanted signs up so other people know. Site visit **Sch 1 s 1.1** & **Sch 1 s 1.1** Found a nest and magpies feeding bellow it in open area. Many walkers and riders, none swooped while visiting. Put up signs according to Rebecca's instructions and along bike path area.

Caller wearing hat and hoodie, got behind the ear and swooped 5 times aggressively. Made contact and cut behind ear. Called: Understood situation, is now taking alternate route, just letting know for other people. Will put signs up.

Magpies under fallen tree in backyard: Job given to ACT Wildlife **Sch 1 s 1.1**

PHONE CALL **Sch 1 s 1.1** 29/10/2021: Parent was swooping the dog when outside (fledgling was around) for about a week. Has flown off now and no problem. Family has very tame magpies which they feed by hand; chose not to address feeding at that point.

Report of magpie attacking people in the village from a big pine tree as they cross the bridge. They advised the bird is very aggressive. Requesting signage

Sch 1 s 1.1 site visit: Remember this one from last year. Play groun in center so focused signs around that. **Sch 1 s 1.1** was swooped once on footpath. Rest of the time we walked around no swooping.

3rd year of magpie aggressively swooping at specifically **Sch 2 s 2.2(a)(ii)** doesn't seem to swoop other individuals SITE VISIT **Sch 2 s 2.2(a)(ii)** 26/10: nothing seen, magpies in the adjacent main road area but not doing anything. Phone call indicated caller was swooped once without contact this year, but hasn't had further incident. Is "bird phobic". Will continue to monitor for further activity; at this stage it appears as unlikely to present a risk.

Site visit **Sch 2 s 2.2(a)(ii)** No swooping seen: Walkers and riders using path. Marked nest on map, put signs up. Spoke to elderly lady with her dog who thought this was ridiculous.

Swooped twice on morning walk. Allegedly swooped and cut his daughters face last year. Site visit **Sch 2 s 2.2(a)(ii)** The house is across from a playground and green strip so have put signs in this area. Trevor the reporter came out of the house so we had a chat, he was understanding and listened to some tips about how to best live with them. Appreciated the signs to warn other people. Spotted a nest which is marked near playground. No was swooped while visiting: Lady and dog, next door neighbours daughter was on the park, all of us outside the house.

Currawong (reported initially as crow). Lady wants signs up to warn other people walking past. Has never made contact. Site visit, no swooping seen or bird present. Good weather conditions. 2nd report to say signs need to be moved, it is actually swooping at **Sch 2 s 2.2(a)(ii)** in page. 2nd site visit: Moved the signs. Rainy day. Heard currawong and chics, made calls as I waled underneath but did not swoop.

Phone call: **Sch 2 s 2.2(a)(ii)** just wanted to report as they see lots of people getting swooped from their house along the bike path to the bridge. Site visit **Sch 2 s 2.2(a)(ii)** & **Sch 2 s 2.2(a)(ii)** Many bike riders, walkers, dogs. No swooping seen, no magpie seen. Had good info from the reporter where signs needed to go for when it is swooping.

Site visit seen in area but not swooping. Slgnage erected to prevent incident with scooter stations. Will call if further issues.

22/9/21 Same as Blackburn x Macfarlane.

Swooping son on bike, he has fallen off from it once, chases for about 100m, signage desired. 22/9/21 SIGNS ERECTED. Nest located and chicks seen, didn't swoop a dog, cyclist, walker or me.

Miner birds. Previously reported last year, Minor bird. Towards community centre too; many wheelchairs going through area

Very aggressive magpie harassing cyclists on the roadside path. Is of some concern as it's a very busy road. He was hit on the ear a couple of times. SITE VISIT: 5/9/21 Magpie observed swooping 3 cyclists. One had an visible cut on their ear. Signs erected

Magpies harassing cyclists. He was hit a few times whilest cycling, and it left a few welts on his neck and shoulders. Doesn't usually call but was very concerned.

Caller reported that a magpie is swooping all day, hitting players and cutting them. Call: Has been occurring since around the 15th. People have tried PPE, umbrellas and other methods but the magpie is attacking from the ground. They have collected numerous incident reports, though no photos. It has drawn blood multiple times. Many of the clients are elderly. **Sch 1 s 1.1** site visit 30/9/21, nest located, younger fledgling in it. No swooping observed as raining, though bad wing culprit magpie sighted. Will go again tomorrow if weather clement. 1/10/21 Bird seen but not swooping. No further reports, may have stopped. Will keep an eye on the situation and let person know to call if any further issues.

A magpie has been swooping the caller and children outside their house. It has hit his 2yo son in his arms near the eye, causing a scratch, though he did not require medical attention, and is alright. He is not sure there's much we can do, but wanted to report the problem. He would appreciate being called back after the site visit. SITE VISIT **Sch 1 s 1.1** Nothing seen besides some mobile fledglings hanging around near the kid's playground. No nest located. It's possible that they've finished now? Keep an eye on it if anything else pops up.

The bird nest is on the opposite side of customer's address - swooping occurring on both sides of the road on Ross smith crescent and the radius of swooping is 3 houses down from the tree in front of 27 ross smith crescent (where the nest is located).

Phone call made. No further action required.

Phone call - Swooping and snapping on steep hill towards Owen Dixon Dr. Caller would like signs put up. Site visit: Spotted a magpie but no walkers swooped.

50 m swooping distance. non specific. no contact seen. requesting signs

Swooping in backyard: were swooping boys on trampoline. Seems to have calmed a little but signage would help. SITE VISIT: Large flock of birds (all juveniles now) hanging around **Sch 2 s 2.2(a)(ii)**. Concentration of them looks like the occupant might be feeding them. Couldn't find the nest, but no feeding behaviours identified. Most of the ruckus was from the magpies fighting each other.

Reporter sustained cut to ear. Talked to a couple walking they've had no problems walking it regulary. Parents and kids walking nearby. Placed signs where possible as described.

/Magpie targeting children continually **Sch 1 s 1.1** Site visit 17/10/2021 Fledgling on the ground. Nothing else seen. Quite likely it has finished, will continue to monitor for further reports.

Previous report has been submitted, ranger has previously put sign up but caller was advised to call again if the bird persisted as carers keep getting swooped and have fallen over multiple times as a result. SITE VISIT 1/10/2021 Magpie swooped [redacted] repeatedly, making contact with both feet and beak (video footage available), but no injury occurred with a broad brimmed hat. May be considered of a moderate to high risk for the general public. One fledgling is completely out of the nest and flying around, the other is still in the nest. It may resolve itself in a few days, but will monitor the situation.

[redacted] site visit nothing seen fledglings on ground. Behaviour has likely ended for time being. Will monitor for any further reports of activity.

Caller saw two children with dogs and sticks being swooped. She was swooped but not injured, another carer visiting the area was reported to have been attacked requiring a hospital visit. 23/09/21 [redacted] attended to put up signs; was continuously swooped by single male magpie, made contact on several occasions. Witnessed resident on corner block get swooped consistently even though hiding under large umbrella.

Caller reported that a magpie hit her child's helmet while cycling near the centre. She also mentioned that it has been swooping in the general area. Caller seemed amicable and mainly wanted to make sure that people were made aware of it. 6/6/21 SITE VISIT: Nest adjacent to childcare centre. Female is sitting in nest, male was hanging around but didn't seem interested, even when I rode a bike up and down the road and footpath, and circled the tree repeatedly. At present presents a minimal risk as childcare centre is operating at minimal capacity.

On bike path in Haig park 30m before the sign that says Sullivans Creek near the kids play area. Was riding his bike, didn't make contact but wanted signs as it's near a playground. Could see magpie and hear babies. Watched 6 bikes and 3 walkers pass along the bike path, bird did not show interest.

Second bird reported by [redacted] (other one T1). A flock of magpies (4-5 individuals sighted) are hanging around the intersection, and the doorstep of the Croatian Club (possible feeding?). At current I can't discern if it is an individual or a number of birds. They appear to only be targeting cyclists, a large number of which went through while I was watching. A few were swooped (unsure if contact made, but if it was it was the top of the helmet), but subsequent cyclists' reactions were mitigated after some signage was put up. More signs are needed (I ran out) to cover both road and footpath cyclists. They do not appear to be targeting pedestrians at this stage, corroborated by a few candid interviews with local pedestrians. This behaviour appears to be relatively recent (a few days). Will continue to monitor, and put up additional signs tomorrow. This may possibly be connected to the magpie reported by Mr Keks. 3/11/21 Appears to have stopped AWH cyclists no incident

Two different birds (Other put in separate report T2). Client believes needs some attention. Client witnessed someone nearly fall off their bike while being swooped (not sure which bird). SITE VISIT [redacted] 31/10/2021 Nest in tree adjacent to crossing. Small baby in there being fed by parents. Two signs erected either side of crossing (need to go back tomorrow to put up a few more). Several magpies in the area with mobile fledglings, which were not swooping, though they were fed by someone at the playground. Bird not seen swooping, but conversations with the public indicated it was swooping above the crossing guard's head (quite likely the big sign seemed threatening). Crossing guard or parents have not reported at current. Will continue to monitor tomorrow during peak hours.

[redacted] her husband and her son were repeatedly swooped while riding bikes past the library (carpark side with plastic barriers). It hit the top of the son's helmet but no injuries/contact otherwise. Nest was located adjacent to childcare centre. Two magpies were feeding chicks but weren't swooping at the time. People riding scooters at the skate park hadn't seen it swooping either. Signs erected.

Called [redacted] Bird is in his front yard, doesn't swoop them but does target people passing by. He quite likes his birdies and just wants to make sure people are aware.

Pedestrians walking and cycling past the area around 102-108 are being swooped. 6/9/21 SITE VISIT: Rode up and down footpath on bike; was swooped a few times, beak clacks and wing snaps but no contact. Got off bike and walked around; it yelled for a bit but lost interest when I started digging around a mulch pile. Numerous walkers and dogs went past with no incident. Nest not located, but possibly in the tree outside 108. Caller was quite happy with signs and explanation, will call if anything changes

Caller was swooped on two separate occasions by magpies at this intersection, both times on a bicycle. The first time he sped away to avoid it and was not contacted. The second time he was pecked on his helmet, panicked and tried to speed away again but wound up swerving into the grass. He is reporting it as he thinks it is very dangerous. [redacted] 2/10/21: Phone call: [redacted] is relatively new to Canberra/ Australia and is unfamiliar with magpies behaving like this. He was very traumatised by the incident and his friend has had a bad experience in which she was pecked on the neck and back. He was keen to learn more about magpies and wants to be informed after a site assessment has been conducted. He was quite firm in the belief that something should be done in these circumstances, and didn't seem to think it was very fair that people should have to put up with this kind of risk. I advised [redacted] to go slower and use PPE instead of trying to outrun the bird, as the worst incidents in many magpie attacks are often linked to the reaction. He wasn't particularly open to this idea, but is planning to avoid the area, and potentially cycling in general for the period of the swooping season. I will be sending him an informative email with some links about headgear sunnies etc. The magpie is nesting in a big tree LH side, ~30m prior to the intersection, citybound. [redacted] Site visit: Could not locate nest, or identify any swooping birds. There was a mobile fledgling on a tree nearby, and some magpies engaged in a turf war with some peewees, but several cyclists went past without incident. It is probable that the swooping was in anticipation of the fledgling leaving the nest. [redacted] 5/10/2021 13:33 Called back, he's happy to hear it's probably stopped, will keep an eye out for future incidents.

Magpie swooped him persistently several times while he was erecting signs. didn't hit him but was quite alarming. Site visit: Kids were playing on playground with parent, magpie was present but not swooping, they haven't had any trouble on other visits either. Put sign up anyway. [redacted]

2 dead magpies found on nature strip and driveway. Called but it led incorrectly to DAS. Unable to follow up due to lockdown (can't visit house)

Caller reported a magpie having swooped a customer's ear causing it to bleed quite badly. He has been avoiding the park since, and seemed happy with signs. SITE VISIT: 6/9/21 Singular Magpie sighted but not interested despite repeatedly cycling past. Signs erected. A walker with a dog went past with no incident.

A few complaints have come through to the Bld manager (caller) but no reported injuries. He saw it swoop a cyclist but they didn't care. Would be happy with some signs. [redacted] Semi-informal email sent to [redacted] for his own interest about magpies and ways to protect yourself while cycling as a personal FYI in regards to the phone call (He is new to Australia). Was responded to by another person (not [redacted] the email slightly misconstrued as advice for the building complex. Sent a further email clarifying that it was not intended as such.

Same person as [redacted] (ii). Wants signs. [redacted] 16/10/2021 Signs erected, magpies seen hanging out back of montessori primary school having an argument with choughs, but nothing seen otherwise.

Magpie swooped caller and her pram+child from Macgillivray st to their house at [redacted] Wants to talk to a ranger. [redacted] SITE VISIT 6/10/2021 Could not locate magpie in question. There is a large group of somewhat insistent magpies gathered around the kebab shop on Novar st, that accosted me when I was trying to eat a sandwich, but the only magpies that I sighted between the given addresses (hanging around next to the school) showed no interest, despite riding a bike back and forth. A passer-by mentioned that they had been swooped near the oval, but I couldn't investigate as school was in attendance. Will try to contact the caller and monitor the site for further activity. Put in second report under [redacted] strong. [redacted] Phone Call 15/10/2021 came "very close" but no contact made. "It wanted to peck my eyes out" "I feel very vulnerable" "I have PTSD" Will put signs out this afternoon. [redacted] Signs erected. Magpie seen fighting with some choughs in the back of the childcare centre but showed no interest in me or other walkers.

SITE NOTES: From the look of it the chicks are very fresh (being fed but still barely visible in the nest, not sitting properly). The situation has been inflamed by the resident below the tree instinctually hitting one of the birds (very hard, in his words) with a ball thrower (not intentionally) after it swooped towards him and his dog. He understands they're just being birds
