Block 34 PADDYS RIVER Congwarra, Pise Home PADDYS RIVER

Congwarra is one of the oldest occupied properties in the Paddys River area. Originally a pastoral run taken up by Andrew Cunningham in 1848, it became a series of selections in the 1860s, some occupied by 'dummy' selectors on behalf of Cunningham when he was the squire of Lanyon. While the present house post-dates that era, the connection with 'Lanyon' still existed in 1910 and the house remains as one of the few surviving continuously occupied properties in the Paddys River area. The additions and modifications do not detract from the essential form imposed by the original pise rooms and are examples of the way a basic dwelling has been to meet changing needs.
