HACKETT OVAL TREES BLOCKS 10-15, SECTION 12, HACKETT

The Hackett Oval Trees are nominated for their potential significance to the early development of Canberra. They were planted in the early 1930s to screen a proposed cemetery for the northside of Canberra. Although the cemetery was never developed at this location, the trees remained. It is also argued that the trees later provided an important visual and habitat resource for the development of the suburb of Hackett.
